Welcome to the Classic Outback Trial

This event is the fulfilment of the initial concept of the 2008 Red Centre to Gold Coast Trial, where the aim was to run an outback trial event that would finish at Australia's round of the World Rally Championship, Rally Australia. The Classic Outback Trial will embody the exciting features of the Red Centre to Gold Coast Trial but will be shorter, cheaper and easier on rally cars and service crews.

Survey One

As you will have heard by now the event is on. With 30 deposits paid, sponsorship from Nissan Australia, and great support from the NSW towns on the route, it was decided to press on. With the interest received from prospective entrants, we should begin the event with 50 + starters. Please let anyone you think may be interested know about the event.

The first major survey was conducted from 16th to 23rd March. Phil Rainer and myself drove an effortless 670km, 7 hours up the Newell Highway to Forbes in the Nissan XTrail four cylinder diesel turbo, and then tackled the Trial route proper. Average fuel consumption for the 3,321km entire survey was 8.8ltr/100k. For someone looking for a light duty 4WD capable of handling challenging rally roads, this is a great vehicle.

A major factor in selecting Forbes as the starting point for the event was the central location. An easy 6 hours from Sydney, 7 hours from Melbourne and a (not so easy) 10-12 hour trip from Brisbane. Although feeling the squeeze like all major regional centres, the City of Forbes has warmly welcomed the event and provided us with every assistance.

Another factor was that my sister and brother in law, have, for the past 20 years been "fine upstanding" citizens of the town. Ian is a past Mayor and Yvonne, a former community nurse and women's health worker who shared the 2007 Citizen of the Year award, has also been a Rotary president and member of many council committees. Their assistance has opened many farm gates in the area and assisted greatly in obtaining services in Forbes. I am sure you will meet them during our three day stay in Forbes.

The Property owners of Burdenda, north east of Tottenham gave us carte blanche over the their 36,000 acres, properties, and we found 37km of very "interesting" farm tracks, most of it running beside the Bogan River. The hospitality given to us by Sue and Ben at Burdenda and Dee and Bruce Brierley from Gwabegar was outstanding and is one of the highlights in organising these events through the Australian outback.

A brief run down of the competitive sections:

Day 1: Three stages total competitive approximately 80km, transport approximately 275km

Forbes overnight

Day 2: Four stages total competitive approximately 94km, transport approximately 446km Coonabarabran overnight

Day 3: There will be a loop around Coonabarabran, still to be surveyed Coonabarabran overnight

Day 4: Four stages total competitive approximately 122km, transport approx 400km Inverell or Glen Innes overnight

Day 5: Still to be surveyed

Day 6: Still to be surveyed

The next survey is 20th - 27th April



Rally Australia WRC stages:

Servicing: The entry fee includes registration of one service crew and service instructions. Additional service crew fee will be \$50.

The service crews will be travelling on bitumen for the majority of the event, some good quality gravel roads will also be used.

LPG, diesel and ULP+ is readily available around the course.

Dust: Again dust will be a problem. You will notice in the Sup Regs the inclusion of dust lights and UHF radio as standard equipment.

Gates: As per the RCGCT we will be opening and closing several gates during the event. One stage will require the person in the non drivers seat to extricate themselves from the vehicle on about 15 occasions. I understand the Blue Tooth headsets are now available!

We will be erecting a warning sign 150 meters prior to each gate.

Forbes rallies for outback car trial

Forbes will host up to 200 motoring enthusiasts later this year when a week-long rally trial gets underway in the shire.

Repco Rally Australia's 2009 Classic Outback Trial will begin in Forbes on Monday, August 31, with up to 60

classic rally cars expected to compete.

The actual competition will be held on rural properties in the Forbes and Condobolin shires but the event will also include a welcome function at Forbes Town Hall on Sunday, August 30.

Coordinator of the competition and former rally driver, Philip Bernadou, said the event should bring about 60 vehicles to Forbes and about 200 people will

spend several days and nights in the town.

Mr Bernadou, the brother of well-known Forbes resident Yvonne Shaw, said the rally should provide a boost to the least second or the least sec to the local economy and will interest all car lovers and motor sport enthusiasts.

Day one of the competition, a loop from Forbes to Condobolin and back, will start near Town Hall and the rally cars are expected to be on show for interested locals

rally cars are expected to be on show for interest of the before the rally moves on.

Mr Bernadou said Forbes was well suited to host the start of the seven day rally, being centrally located for Victorian, NSW and Queensland competitors.

"We looked at Griffith and Dubbo [as potential rally start regired but both those places were a bit big for our

start points] but both those places were a bit big for our purposes, and plus, having some connection to the Forbes area, I thought I could utilise the contacts I had,"
Mr Bernadou said.

The rally starts in Forbes in late August and will cul-

The rally starts in Forbes in late August and will culminate in Tweed Heads on Saturday, September 5.

It is a lead-up event to this year's Australian round of the World Rally Championships and is expected to attract between 50 and 60 vehicles, ranging from pre-1981 historic rally cars, classic rally cars built prior to '83, production cars built prior to '96 and station wagon-type recreational four wheel drives made prior to 1990.

The Forbes-Condobolin loop on day one is set to follow some of the easier sections of the annual Condo 750 4WD off road event, which is staged each April.

Mr Bernadou said spectators are not encouraged to

enter private land to watch the rally but there will be opportunities for people to view the start of the Forbes stage and attend the welcoming function.

"We hope to have the cars on display outside Town Hall on Sunday [August 30] afternoon and another dis-play before the first day of competition on Monday

morning," he said.

"We may also use the showground on Monday afternoon as a service area for the cars."

After Forbes the rally moves on to Coonabarabran for the second and third stages, and Casino for the fourth

The fifth and final days of competition will be held in weed Heads, and will feature sections of the World Rally Championship course, which gets underway as the

Running alongside the trial and sharing the same overnight stops will be the Classic Outback Tour, open to any road registered vehicle and without the requirement for roll-over protection or other special rally modifica-tions.
