RESPECT THE LAND

After 16 months of negotiating, 7 surveys and thousands of kilometres, the 2018 road book has been completed. The 7 survey trips totalling 69 days in the Alice have been a delight and at sometimes a little frustrating but now we have a great special stage rally. With 36 special stages totalling just under 900 kilometres it will be another challenging long-distance event. The stages will suit both the big horsepower and the nimble smaller cars. I apologise in advance to the newly painted vehicles. Maybe a plastic wrap would be recommended, as there are a couple of

stages where the fauna is a tad close to the tracks. This is shaping up to be the most heavily contested COT. Still a few entries to be received but there are currently 45 listed and a lot of modifications and testing has been going on to past entrants. Special thanks to David (Dinta) Officer for his great assistance and support over the past 16 months.

The 2016 event threw some curved balls at us with the hail and rain cancelling the first day of competition but unless the centre receives some substantial rain over the next 2 months we will encounter the opposite this

year, dry and sandy. I think a bucket and spade should be a vital part of your in car equipment!!

Although no "Hayes Highway" this year there are still plenty of challenging stages with 8 over 40 km in length. As in past COTs we have included for your driving enjoyment another horror stage. Day 6, Whitewood, covering 52 km, will need to be driven with respect. Very tight, sandy and rocky, it has it all. Full details of leg distances with service and refuelling points will be listed in the first Bulletin out soon and outlined in the Guide to Competitors, available end July.


EVENT CALENDAR
