the past week completing and checking the road books after being rained out 5 weeks ago around Condobolin and Orange.

It was my first opportunity to be driven over the stages that David and Ross found late last year. What a job they have done. We were blessed with superb dry weather, although a bit chilly. A great mixture of stages is on offer for this year's COT, from some tight property tracks through scrub to flat out on large properties; to tight forestry around Condobolin to the totally different style of forestry roads around Orange and Bathurst, and then there are the 11 shire roads! There is something for everyone. A true COT event. It will come down to vehicle preparation, the driver reading the roads accurately and the co-driver reading the road book with precision. If one fails that will be it. So to win you will have to excel in all 3 aspects. Day 5 has 5 shire roads and Day 6 is possibly the best day with some magnificent pine forest roads.

The infamous 50km Back Yamma on the third day, was a bit greasy and amazingly we only saw 4 kangaroos in the forest! However they are still out there in vast numbers along with a few feral pigs. We spent the best part of 2 hours clearing fallen trees, a good workout. As reported on Facebook that after 8 years and 10 events we finally removed the

overhanging tree. Why did it take so long?



After weeks of COVID-19 lockdown, Bruce Keys and I were very happy to hit the road in late May to do the route survey for the COT20 Regularity event.

Previous COT Regularity entrants have included marques like MG, Bentley, Austin Healey and Morgan. So, we were looking for sections that would both challenge regularity competitors and give them some fun – while keeping in mind that they are NOT full house special stage rally cars.

We've chosen a mix of rally special stages and dedicated regularity sections, including both forest and shire road sections. Competitors will do three or four regularities a day, most of which will have multiple tests.

We had terrific autumn weather for the trip, but, they've had a bit of rain up there - Central-west NSW is looking great and the barley and wheat crops will be well advanced when the event runs.

Some of the COT sections are just spectacular... we were in awe of what we saw. I guess one advantage of COT Regularity is that crews can enjoy some of that amazing scenery – unlike the drivers in the COT Rally.
