#### is there an event?

June 24th we received news that our Clerk of Course, Tom Snooks, suffered a mild stroke and was recovering in hospital. Thankfully he is now home recuperating but the path to recovery will be lengthy. We all wish to see Tom make a speedy recovery. Tom has withdrawn his services as Clerk of Course for 2021 Classic Outback Trial.

The Classic Outback Trial has always been a celebration of camaraderie, a social event that brings people together from all walks of life from around the world, together we race as one. We are once again faced with the uncertainty of, "if, then how?"

#### Do we cancel?

No. So many people have spent the past 18 months working on the event and to toss it away does not seem like an option. We have come too far, we need this. Social distancing and the Classic Outback Trial is like mixing oil with water. We are a bonded family.

#### Do we postpone?

We envisage that by March/April 2022 the vaccination rate will be high enough to allow state and international borders to reopen. Hopefully by that time we might even be able to entice the internationals to return. COVID should have settled and even Tom may be able to assist

We are currently exploring opportunities for the first 1/4 of 2022 and will know what options are available in the upcoming weeks. We want to thank you all for your patience and understanding during these uncertain times.

### **ROSS RUNNALLS, COURSE CHECKER:**

Having just completed the course check I was very happy with the course and the roadbook. The course is very diverse, opening with some fast station roads and tracks interspersed with native pine forests with their winding and gliding tracks between the trees. Then the event moves east into conventional pine forests, which will keep driver and co-driver busy. They are interspersed with some spectacular shire road stages in hilly terrain. The course will be demanding, unlike the forest highways that are the norm down south these days.



It was great to once again get the feel of a long distance rally, which I must admit I am rather fond of. A patient strategic approach is required, to go fast but careful early with the sole aim of staying out of trouble and looking after the car. There is time later to attack when the targets become clearer.

As a co-driver these long blind events call for precision, constant alertness to extract the maximum information from the roadbook in order to reassure and build confidence for the driver.

On the non-competitive side the shared experiences over a number of days establish life long friendships with fellow competitors.

In my experience, while the investment in a single long distance rally may be the same as for a bunch of local events, that experience will remain in the memory longer than a collection of shorter events, particularly if it is in a foreign country (not that NSW is a foreign country).

### STEVE HOLLOWOOD ROAD DIRECTOR, COT REGULARITY:

After arriving back from NSW on the weekend, I'm busy with roadbook and schedule updates from the COT21 Regularity course check.

Our checker, Frank Grant, made few changes. But, we've had to make some adjustments for winter running and other changes to both the route and the schedule to fit in with COT Rally.

There has been a lot of rain in the area, particularly on the western end of the event – days 1 and 2. Farmers in the plains area of the Central West will be looking forward to good seasons. But, we've had to make a couple of re-routes to get around some soggy bits.

We also have an additional Regularity section on day 3, to make a total of 27 sections for the event. 14 sections are

Regularity only and 13 sections are shared with COT Rally – with Regularity running before or after the Rally competition.

We first surveyed some of these roads 18 months ago and it's really pleasing to see how the route has held together. Regularity competitors will be both challenged and tested, while enjoying travelling through an interesting and beautiful part of NSW.



Back to the roadbook updates!


























### WHEEL SPIN REGULATION INTRODUCTION


With little feedback regarding the 2018 Storybook we're wondering what you think? Let us know on Facebook.
