REGULARITY ROUTE CHECK REPORT

La Niña summer rains in the Central West have certainly had an impact... The country looks great, farmers are happy, grain storages are chockers and even the sheep and cows look happy - except for those who have worked out why they're being fattened up.

But, there is a down side... There is still standing water in places we've never seen it before, in spots roads are a bit "bonier" than they were, there's a bit of damage caused by run-off and the grass on the verges has gone crazy!

We've made a few changes to the Regularity route thanks to La Niña, and also to allow for changes to the COT Rally event especially where we share sections.

The main change is on day 3. We've added a brand new section and a new coffee stop. Lunch on Day 3 will now be at Cudal at the



delightful Platypus Cafe. The rest of the regularity route is pretty much "as was".

Despite impacts and minor changes, regularity competitors will enjoy a challenging competition on a very picturesque drive through the Central West. Competition includes regularity only sections on great minor roads and shared rally sections on closed shire and forest roads.

As well, between competition sections we've included attractions like McFeeters Motor Musem, Utes in the Paddock and Sculpture down the Lachlan and amazing locations like Carcoar, Sofala and Mt Panorama. Something for everyone!

Next job is to update everything - the Guide to the Event and Roadbooks are first so we can get them all to the printer. And then all the final details... with only a few weeks to go.

Current NSW weather forecasts are certainly concerning and our thoughts are with the thousands of People who have been impacted. I know Phil, Dinta and I will be watching the BOM website closely in the next couple of weeks.

We're really looking forward to this Regularity Event and to seeing you all in Parkes. We started planning this regularity event in 2019 and it will be very, very good finally getting this last ever Classic Outback Trial on the road.
